PROJECT EXPERIENCE

An Analysis of the Influence of Confucianism, Buddhism, and Taoism on Su Shi - taking the “Qian Chibi Fu” as an Example

- Conducted a comprehensive textual analysis of *The First Prose Poem on the Red Cliffs* to identify intersections of Confucian, Buddhist, and Taoist philosophies in Su Shi’s literary framework.
- Authored and scripted a research-driven video presentation, integrating scholarly interpretations with multimedia elements to enhance accessibility for interdisciplinary audiences.
- Presented the finalised video at the 2020 UBC “Chinese Literature and Film Studies” seminar, moderated scholarly discussions and iteratively refined the project based on peer-reviewed feedback.

An Analysis of the Positive Significance and Negative Effects of *Lust Caution*

- Executed a literary analysis of Eileen Chang’s *Lust Caution*, evaluating its avant-garde narrative techniques and thematic tensions between personal desire and political betrayal.
- Assessed the novel’s socio-political subtexts, contextualising its controversial reception within 20th-century Chinese literary criticism and postcolonial discourse.
- Analysed the dualistic impact of the text, emphasising its progressive representations of gender while also addressing critiques related to moral ambiguity and historical revisionism.

The Risk of Urdu in South Asia

- Focused on Urdu’s sociolinguistic evolution, emphasising its emergence through Persianate cultural hegemony, diglossia with Hindi, and the role of Sufi mystics, Mughal patronage, and British colonial policies in shaping its identity as a vehicle for both vernacular modernity and communal division in 18th-19th century South Asia.
